These beautiful paving stones salvaged from the Abby Aldrich Rockefeller Sculpture Garden, New York City. Designed by the acclaimed American architect Philip Johnson, the garden was unveiled to the public in 1964. The stone was acquired in the historic demolition of the garden to make way for new construction of the expanded Museum of Modern Art. Steeped in history, the stone has gracefully supported the weight of sculptures created by such artists as Lachaise, Matisse, Oldenburg, and Rodin.

Other uses for this amazing historic stone can include paving stones or small table tops.
