This clock was originally installed in the Union Depot train station located in Troy, New York. It was part of the renovation to the third version of the terminal completed in the early 1900s. The renovation was executed by the architectural firm Reed & Stern and debuted concepts that would later be used in this already acquired commission for Grand Central Terminal. Reed & Sterns' early 20th Century renovation reflected popular architectural trends of the period. The sculptural elements surrounding the 30" clockface elegantly demonstrate characteristic consistent with the Beaux Arts movement used throughout the terminal. Fashioned in a white terracotta, glazed in an emerald green, and divided into sections, the mass of the clock boasts beautifully details relief demonstrating classic Grecian motifs.
