This intricate door and transom were designed and made by the Samuel Yellin Company and is a magnificent example of his medieval and Renaissance inspired ironwork. The door and transom, pictured, measure approximately 3'5" wide and 8'5" tall. Yellin was a major figure in the early twentieth century Arts and Crafts movement, a master of his trade and a versatile and prolific designer of decorative ironwork. He is widely recognized as the foremost blacksmith and metal artist in this country. Some of Yellin's commissions include the private residences of the most influential and wealthiest Americans at the turn of the last century, including J.P. Morgan, Henry Clay Frick, Andrew Mellon, as well as work for the DuPont's, Rockefeller's and Vanderbilt's. Outside of work for private families, Yellin's artistry has graced the finest edifices in many American cities from the National Cathedral in Washington DC to the Seattle Art Museum. The largest and finest collection of Yellin's work is available to view as part of the Morgan Collection, and in situ at the Federal Reserve Bank on Wall Street in New York City.

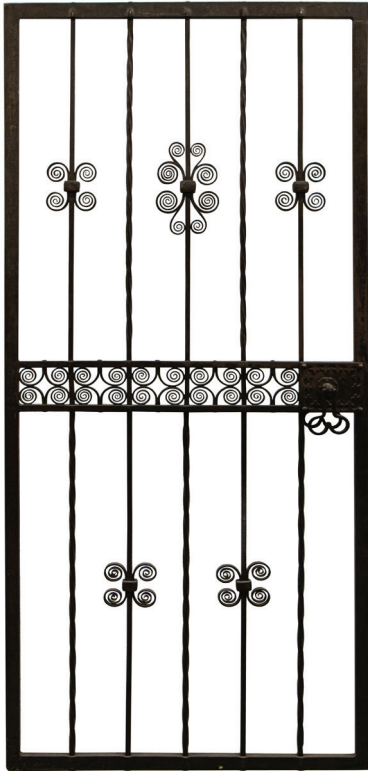

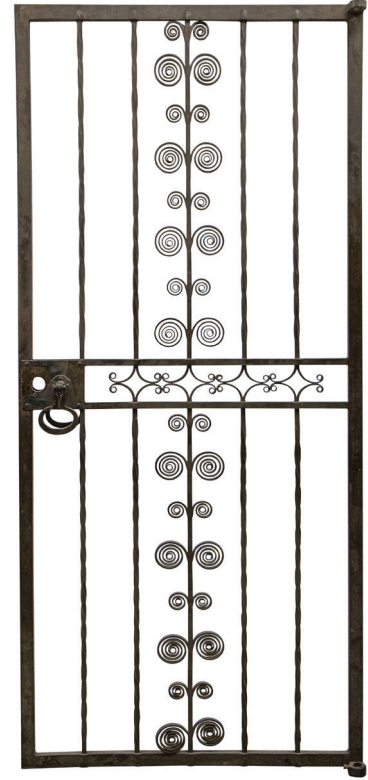
